A formal, academic conference proceedings is being published in conjunction with the event.

SCIENCE FICTIONS, POPULAR CULTURES is soliciting 15- to 20-minute academic presentation proposals, along with the option to publish a formal, peer-reviewed academic proceedings paper, from a wide spectrum of disciplines addressing the narratives and performances of science, science fiction, and popular entertainment across media, platforms, and cultures. As scholars, we create dynamic intersections with public programming at *HawaiiCon* which leverages the intellectual engagement audiences bring to their enthusiastic appreciation and deep knowledge of pop culture.

Possible topics include but are not limited to:

- World-building in genres & across media
- Science in/of Science Fiction
- Universe creation (*Cosmos* to Marvel)
- Critical analysis of science fiction and popular culture intersections
- Teaching of/with Popular Culture & Science Fiction (across disciplines)
- STEM, STEAM, and Science Fiction
- Translating/Adapting Science Fiction across media and cultures
- Popular interpretations and implications of Science Fictions
- Cultures of Science Fictions and Science Fiction fandom
- Performing Science/Science Fiction (live and mediated)
- Playing Science/Science Fiction (cosplay, games, gaming)

Please submit a 200-300 word abstract of your proposed presentation, plus a 100 word biographical sketch to SFPC conference co-chairs Carrie J. Cole and Jason Eberl, using the online form at <a href="http://www.caperteam.com/sfpc/">http://www.caperteam.com/sfpc/</a>. Proposals will be reviewed starting now on a rolling basis at the beginning of each month until May 15; submit early to ensure best opportunity and earliest notification for acceptance.

Our academic conference is uniquely embedded within a much larger convention, *HawaiiCon*. Accepted presenters may also be invited to participate as genre experts *HawaiiCon* public discussion panels. Attendance to the entirety of the larger *HawaiiCon* conference is included with the SFPC registration fee, as well as a copy of the published peer-reviewed, academic proceedings.
